For over two decades Matt Borron had dedicated his career to advocating for communities, service members, veterans and military families on the local, state and federal level. Since 2012, Matt has been with the Association of Defense Communities (ADC), a national non-profit organization representing communities and states

with a significant military presence and currently serves as Executive Director.

As Executive Director, he oversees the organization's day-to-day operations, including managing the development of the association's educational events, membership councils, and is lead for federal policy development and advocacy.

As the primary point of contact for ADC members and stakeholders, he works closely with the House and Senate Defense Communities Caucus, key offices in DOD and other federal agencies to coordinate policy efforts that support military-community partnership efforts and defense infrastructure.

Prior to his time at ADC, Matt taught history and managed the U.S. Department of Labor's Veterans Upward Bound program at Montana State University- Billings, and served as a Congressional Intern for U.S. Representative Denny Rehberg (MT)

Mr. Borron served in the U.S. Army Reserve for 16 years, with a final assignment as Chief Ordnance Inspector for the 3998th Combat Support and Sustainment Battalion. He continues to serve in the Inactive Ready Reserve force.
